Sensory Learning

When Guarino decided to write a classbook, she turned her students' love for snacks into a creative writing activity.

Snacks Inspire Creativity

Classbook Project Strengthens Confidence

"Creating a classbook together helped my students so much with their writing confidence! Student Overcomes Writing Challenge

Guarino noticed one of her students struggling with writer's block.

"One student struggled with thinking of adjectives to describe their favorite snack. They could only think of things like, 'it tastes good.' After conferring with them and getting their mind to focus on each of their five senses, their creative juices really got flowing and they could tell me many descriptive adjectives for their snack!"

Class Gives Raving Reviews

Guarino's class transformed into expert reviewers after their publishing project.

"They were in shock! They couldn't wait to see their page in the book and to share it with their classmates. We all read our pages aloud to the class and everyone was so supportive of one another. We gave each other raving reviews, along with many compliments and positive comments about our published work!"

Visual Progress Tracker Motivates Students

A visual display helped keep Guarino organized in the classbook writing process.

"Make sure to give yourself enough time to complete the entire process and keep track of which students are at each step of the writing process."

Guarino encourages using resources for this project.

"At first, I didn't have this information, but then I made a visual display of which student was at each step and I think it motivated students even more to finish their work! They felt so proud of themselves when they were done!"



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
